

## TO STAY VIGILANT AND SAFE ONLINE, HERE ARE 4 STEPS TO BE S.U.R.E.



- Check the origin of the content and see if it is an authentic source
- Beware of fake websites that imitate official ones






- Stick to the facts Be wary when the content is vague in details and lacks factual information (e.g. dates, times, places)
- Look out for errors Fake news and scams usually contain spelling, grammatical and punctuation errors





- Dig deeper Search online for mentions of the suspicious content from credible news sites
- Multiple sources Find at least two or more credible news sources to confirm if the information is authentic





- Two sides to a story Some content may be biased and not reflect the actual incident. Consider other sides to the story
- Exercise fair judgement Consider if the content may be manipulated or edited to influence opinions
