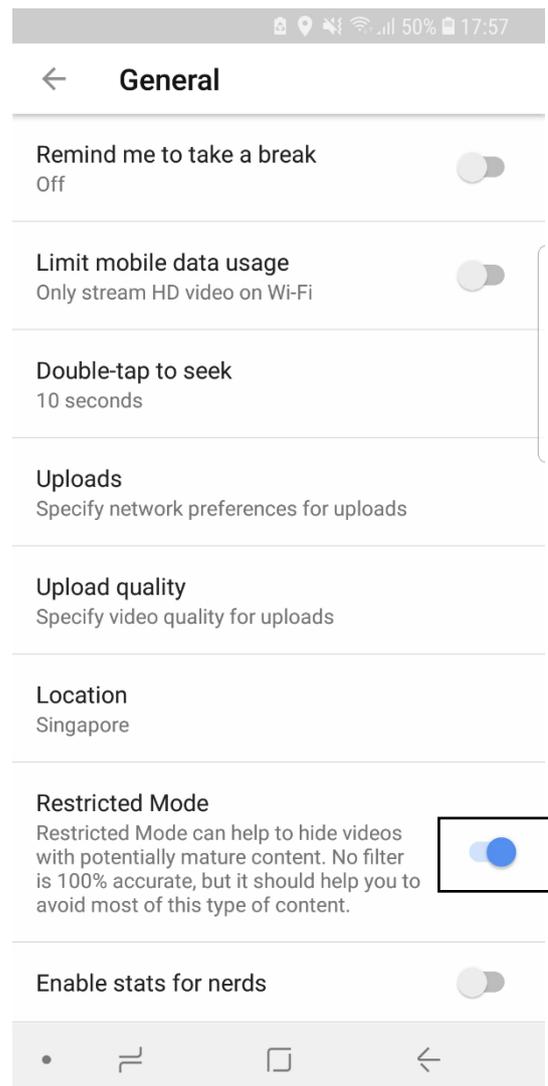
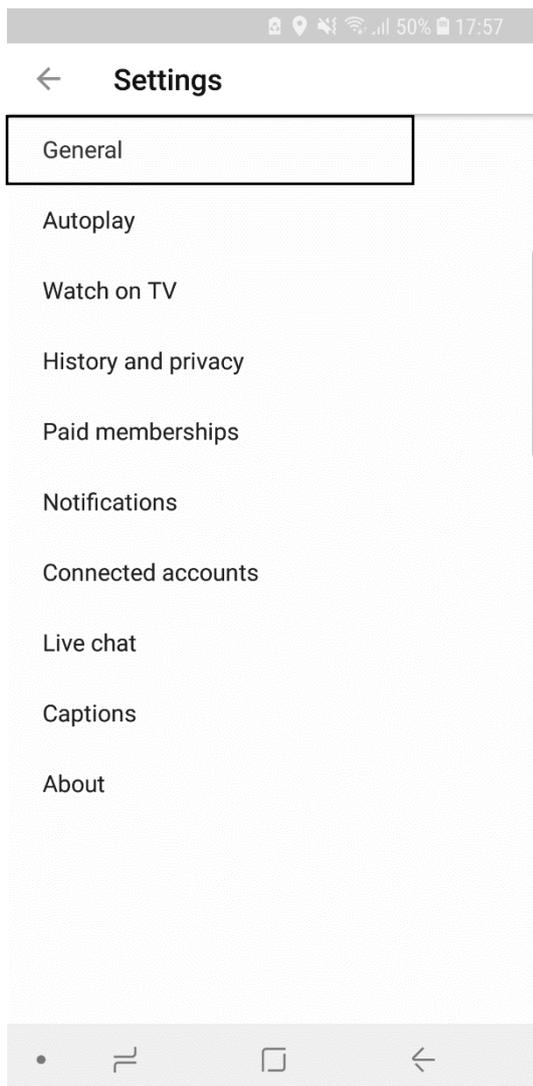
YouTube mainly has settings to control the type of content accessed by an account. It is also possible to block or report an account or specific video.

What do I do?

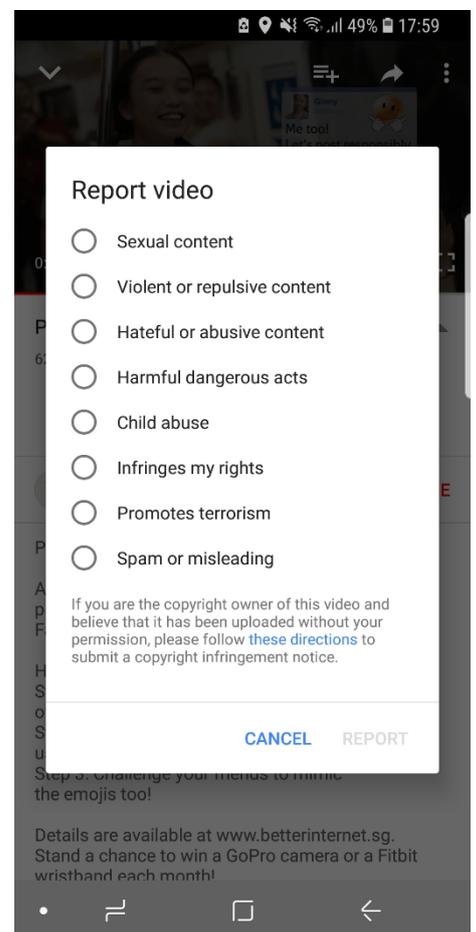
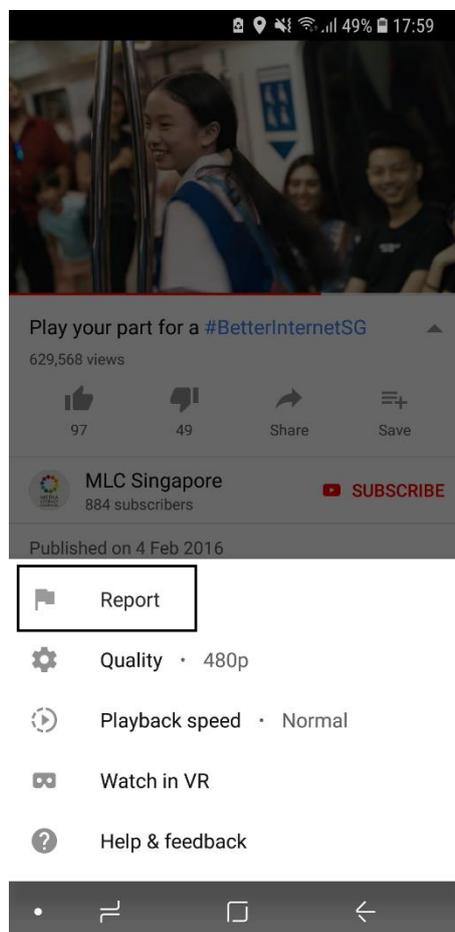
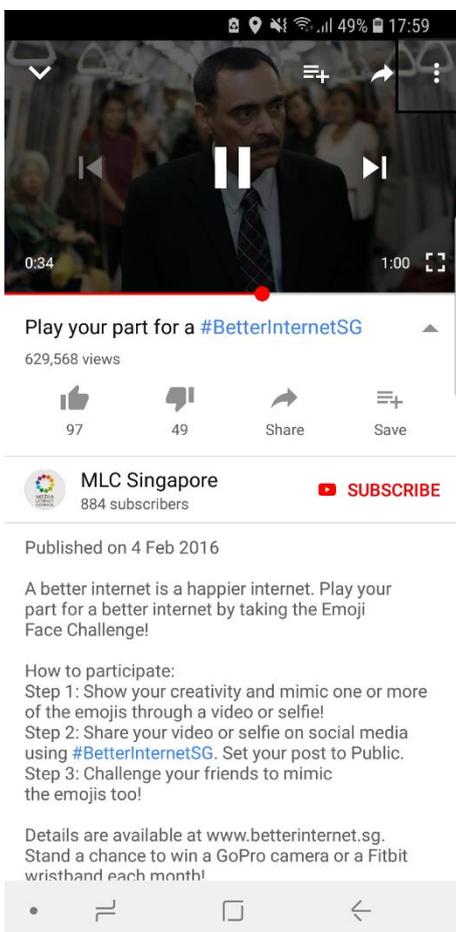
1. On YouTube, click the circular icon on the top right corner for the **Account** page. Click **Settings**.



2. In the Settings, click **General**. Then, turn swiipe the bar next to **Restricted Mode** to the right to turn it on. This hides content that has mature content.



3. You can also report a video if you find it inappropriate or abusive. Go to the video and click the three dotted button on the top right corner. On a computer, this will be the three dotted button directly under the video. In the options that appear, click **Report**. A pop-up box will appear to let you specify why you want to report the video.



4. You can also block an account. Go to the account and click the three dotted button on the top right corner. In the options that appear, click **Block user**. Your child will not be able to watch any videos from this account.
